

Your Private Session Journey

What happens after you contact Aeaea

A private session begins with conversation. The steps below help us understand what is drawing you toward rope, decide whether the session is a good fit, and prepare without asking you to disclose more than is needed. Aeaea private rope sessions are nonsexual professional services; sexual activity is not permitted.

First send an inquiry

Tell me whether you want to experience being tied, learn to tie, practice with a partner, tie me as an experienced practitioner, or begin without being certain. An inquiry is a starting point, not a booking or commitment. Share only what you are comfortable sending online.

Then we discuss fit

We talk about your interests, experience, timing, setting, boundaries, accessibility needs, and expectations. If we both want to continue, I send a written booking summary with the service, fee, date, location, and cancellation terms.

Before booking you complete two required items

Required item	Purpose
Participation Agreement Assumption of Risk and Release	Explains the physical risks and the legal release. Read it carefully and sign it separately.
Client Intake and Session Acknowledgment	Collects relevant safety information and confirms the booking, conduct, privacy, and communication terms.

When a session is being planned

If I will be tying you, complete the separate Rope Experience and Negotiation Worksheet. It is a conversation tool, not a contract or waiver. Checking an item communicates interest or a boundary; it does not guarantee an activity or replace ongoing consent.

On the session day

We review relevant health changes, touch and rope boundaries, communication signals, and what would help you feel supported afterward. You may pause, change, or withdraw consent at any time. I may also modify or stop an activity for safety or professional-boundary reasons.

Optional media permission

The Photo Video and Audio Permission is used only when recording is proposed. It is never required for service. Declining or limiting it will not affect whether you may book a session.

Sensuality, touch, closeness, or discussion of sexuality may arise only within a professional educational or embodiment context. Questions about the process or a document are welcome before you sign.
